There are activities to suit all age ranges. Some call for physical activity outside while others are more reflective and sedentary. Almost all are highly interactive , and most cost nothing at all.

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Showcase of Learning Cost: Nil | School Age Range: 8-18

Inviting the community into schools is a fantastic way to increase community engagement, making our schools accessible and open to visitors to re-affirm their place as the centre of local communities. Invite guest speakers to share their own experiences of school and engage in discussions about how things have changed....and what remains the same.

Reading Across the Generations

Cost: Nil | School Age Range: 2-10

What a great way to bring our community together – sharing a story. We have piloted grandparents, community policy officers, school nurses and local keepers sharing their favourite story or one from the class library. Children love having a new voice read to them.





Vintage Playground Olympics

Cost: Nil | School Age Range: 5-12

Revive classic games like Elastics, Bulldog, Hop Scotch, skipping rhymes and many others by inviting parents, grandparents and community members to share their own experiences and demonstrate the games they loved as children.







Community Values Sanctuaries

Cost: Variable to school | School Age Range: 8-18

Develop a peaceful space for reflection and conversation. Involve the local community in making a place where nature can thrive. This could be a few plant pots filled with herbs and flowers, or an entire garden with water and willow dens, creating a serene communal legacy.



Coffee & Discussion

Cost: Nil | School Age Range: 14-18

Arrange open chats between senior pupils and community members such as local shopkeepers, police, and other residents, who will respond to positive interaction with young people and can be a great source of insight and advice.

Values-Based Parenting and Caring Workshops

Being a good parent or carer isn't easy. There's nobody more important in a child's life, but it can be hugely stressful and emotionally draining. We often forget how important it is to look after ourselves as well as our children.

Parents and carers are invited to join this series of four free online workshops. You will hear practical ways to balance discipline and love, discover simple yet powerful tools to raise happy and balanced children, and learn how to stay patient, loving and mentally healthy.

Let's Talk Memory Game



Designed specially for World Values Day, this board game can be played by children with adults, or by adults with each other, stimulating meaningful discussions in all kinds of situations. There is a workbook which can be used after the game to record observations.

The game is especially helpful in prompting the memories of adults with any kind of memory loss, helping children (and adults) to understand them better and fostering positive connection with them.

Depending on who is playing and where, the game can be played using both the cards and the board, or just using the cards on their own.

The BIG 5 Value for the Future

Cost: Nil | School Age Range: 5-11



Explore the BIG value of TRUTH: Aspiration and ask the BIG question: Which Global Goal would you like to work towards? Pupils reflect on what their aspirations are for themselves, each other and the planet through a:

- Mini meditation called Compassionate Cloud
- Poem called Recipe for a Happy Planet that references the 17 Global Goals for our planet.
- Journal reflection on the Global Goals

ValuesJam

This playful card game is quite simple to play. Just pick a values card (by choice or at random), start with the first question on the reverse and see where the conversation takes you. You can use none, some or all of the other questions and before you move on to another card, make sure to ask the final question. Be open, honest, respectful, kind and curious.

Above all, listen and feel the vibe – every card is different. There are no right or wrong answers. Just share your stories and go with the flow. It's also OK "not to know" yet.
